
Stone Lake's Mask Mandate Is Over



Mr. Roberts 3D







This year Stone Lake's spirit assemblies have been over Zoom. Even though we can't get together in the MP room, it is fun to see all the classes projected on our classroom screen.


I think that was one of the best assemblies we have had this year.
